

Immunization Schedule

Birth - 15 months National Immunization Schedule 2024

When	Vaccine	What is it
At birth or as early as possible till one till one year of age	Bacillus Calmette Guerin (BCG)	BCG is a vaccine for Tuberculosis
At birth or as early as possible within 24 hours	Hepatitis B - Birth Dose	It prevents Hepatitis B
At birth or as early as possible within the first 15 days	Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV)-0	Orally administered polio vaccine
At 6 weeks, 10 weeks & 14 weeks (OPV can be given till 5 years of age)	OPV 1, 2 & 3	Orally administered polio vaccine
At 6 weeks, 10 weeks & 14 weeks (can be given till one year of age)	Pentavalent 1, 2 & 3	Diphtheria, Pertussis (whooping cough), Tetanus, Hepatitis B and Hib disease
Two primary doses at 6 and 14 weeks followed by Booster dose at 9-12 months.	Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine(PCV)	PCV provides protection against Pneumococcal diseases which include Pneumonia, Meningitis, Bacteraemia, sepsis, Otitis and Sinusitis
At 6 weeks, 10 weeks & 14 weeks (can be given till one year of age)	Rotavirus (RVV)	It protects against rotavirus infections, which are the leading cause of severe diarrhea among young children
Two fractional dose at 6 and 14 weeks of age	Inactivated Polio Vaccine (IPV)	Inactivated polio vaccine - shot
9 completed months-12 months. (Measles can be given till 5 years of age)	Measles Rubella (MR) 1st dose	Protects against Measles and Rubella
9 completed months-12 months	Japanese Encephalitis (JE) - 1	Protects against Japanese encephalitis
At 9 completed months with measles-Rubella	Vitamin A (1st dose)	Vitamin A Supplement

Birth - 15 months Optional Vaccines

6 months completed	Typhoid Vaccine	Prevents Typhoid Fever
6 months completed	Influenza Vaccine	Helps prevent Flu
9 months completed	Meningococcal disease Vaccine	Helps prevent meningococcal disease
12-15 months	Varicella Vaccine	Protects against Chickenpox
First dose at 9 months and second dose at 16-24 months	Mumps Vaccine	Usually part of Measles and Rubella vaccine as MMR vaccine - to prevent Mumps
12 months completed, and given in two doses minimum of 6 months apart	Hepatitis A Vaccine	Protects against Hepatitis A
